named The Diamond Jubilee Allotments Society Resolved: To name the site the 'Diamond Jubilee Allotment Society' To generally adopt the Constitution (attached) with obvious changes & explain how the Parish Council would 3. wish to see the site managed (after return of its' initial investment). Following extensive research Chris Hollingsworth reported that the constitution of the Lichfield District Council Allotments site is the most appropriate model to follow, namely that the allotment holders will run and manage the allotments site and initially lease the site from the Parish Council until it can be run independently by the Allotment Committee The Lichfield District Council site has been running for 15 years and runs very well Jill and John Street have experience of renting an allotment at this site and confirmed that the constitution there works well Resolved: In principal to adopt a constitution based on the Lichfield District Council model To Agree Membership Subscriptions if any? 4. Affiliation to the NSALG (National Society of Allotment & Leisure Gardeners Limited) Insurance of the site. Public Liability covered by Shenstone Parish Council. To Agree Membership Subscriptions if any? Initially all plot holders have been charged .45p per sq metre for plot rental & a £5 expression of interest payment which is to be put towards set up costs From 2013 a rental for the plot will be charged plus a fee for subscription to the allotment society A float of £5 per annum per plot was suggested to create a float - this to be discussed further at next meeting Brian Hawthorn Proposed: To levy a £5 charge per plot as an interim payment and then review The Proposal was not voted on - to be confirmed at next meeting. The Forward Plan is that the Allotment Society will be free of debt to the Parish Council for investment made at the site after 4 years in operation Affiliation to the NSALG (National Society of Allotment & Leisure Gardeners Limited) Affiliation to the National Society of Allotment Growers is £35.00 per annum This fee could be covered from the fund raised from each plot owner paying a £5 fee which will provide alloment holders access to their website and forum - a PIN would be issued for access The Allotment Society to affiliate to the National Society of Allotment and Leisure Gardeners Limited which is the recognised body for the allotment movement in the United Kingdom. The Society is owned, managed and funded by its members to protect, promote and preserve allotments for future generations Resolved: The Diamond Jubilee Allotment Committee to affiliate to the National Society of Allotment and Leisure Gardeners Limited Insurance of the site. Discounted Insurance is available through NSALG The Diamond Jubilee Allotments to sign up to the Insurance cover as arranged by NSALG Insurance costs can then be divided up per member Resolved: The Diamond Jubileee Allotment Committee to sign up for Insurance cover as provided by the National Society of Allotment and Leisure Gardeners Limited **Public Liability Insurance** The Parish Council has confirmed that Public Liability Insurance is in place for the Allotment Society under the Parish Council Insurance cover whilst the two associations are working together.
